1- 2024 Matthew O. Barsley Memorial Scholarship will award \$1,500 to a 2024 graduating senior of Lincoln-Sudbury Regional High School who plans on studying fire science or other public service field (preference will be awarded, but not restricted to). The candidate must be planning to attend an accredited college or university. Minimum average of "B" or better. **Completion of a 250 word essay answering, "What do you consider to be a problem with the world today, and how will your education enable you to contribute to a solution?"**

2- 2024 MERIT SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM APPLICATION- The South Middlesex County Alumnae Chapter (SMCAC) of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority will launch their 2024 Merit Scholarship Program on Monday, February 5th. The 2024 Merit Scholarship Program will accept applications between February 5th and March 11th. 1-The Minerva Award- \$2,000
 2-The Torch Award- \$1,500
 3- The Fortitude Award- \$1,000

Applicants must meet the following criteria:

-African American high school senior graduating from the class of 2024
-At least 2.8 GPA on 4.0 scale
-Must plan to enroll as a student at an accredited institution of higher education (2 or 4 years)
-Must live or attend school in Ashland, Framingham, Holliston, Hopkinton, Marlborough, Natick, Sherborn, Sudbury, Wayland or the City of Worcester.

3- HONEY DEW DONUTS SCHOLARSHIP –Honey Dew Donuts will award \$300 (one time only) to a deserving college bound senior student in your graduating class. A Honey Dew Donuts employee or family member of a Honey Dew Donuts employee will take priority when selecting eligible recipients. Must attend an accredited 4-year college or university, maintain a B- average or better, participate in local community/charitable activities, and meet the general requirements as determined by the school's scholarship committee. The scholarship money will be awarded at Honey Dew Donuts Scholarship Breakfast in early June.

4- LINCOLN SCHOLARSHIP COMMITTEE AWARDS - Information for Lincoln high school seniors and their parents/guardians about 2024 scholarships and awards offered by the Lincoln Scholarship Committee is available on the Town Website on February 1, 2024. Eligible students must have completed a minimum of grades 5 through 8 in the Lincoln or Hanscom schools and must be residents of the Town of Lincoln or Hanscom Air Force Base, or who attended Lincoln Public Schools through the METCO Program or who attended Lincoln Public Schools as children of Town of Lincoln Employees.

Lincoln's Community Scholarships offered: Two (2) Ogden Codman Trust scholarships renewable for three(3) years, and The Harriet Todd Scholarship renewable for one(1) year. Awards include The Sumner Smith Community Service Award, and The Fanny S. Campbell Academic Achievement Award. -The Ogden Codman Scholarship: This scholarship offers \$5,000, renewable for up to four years. The scholarship has a broadly-based set of criteria including financial need (as demonstrated on the FAFSA forms), leadership qualities, and academic achievement. This scholarship is only open to Lincoln residents.

-The Codman Opportunity Scholarship: This scholarship offers \$2,500, renewable for up to four years. Financial need (FAFSA forms), student potential, and commitment to success in a specific field or trade are the primary considerations for this scholarship. This scholarship is only open to Lincoln residents.

-The Harriett Todd Scholarship: There will be \$5,000 available per year for up to two years for as many as two students. This award is open to all students who attended Lincoln Public Schools from at least Grades 5-8 and who graduated from Lincoln-Sudbury or a vocational institution whose tuition was paid by the Town of Lincoln. The mission of this scholarship is to encourage students pursuing studies and/or training consistent with Harriet Todd's lifetime of devotion to public service and volunteerism, demonstrating both commitment and integrity to a broad range of civic concerns. The award will be given to support students in their studies at post-secondary institutions upon graduation from high school, including a two or four-year college or university, vocational school, or other post-secondary study or certification training program.

5- LINCOLN SUDBURY YOUTH BASEBALL SCHOLARSHIP - Each spring, LS Baseball awards one or more college scholarships to graduating seniors who have participated in our programs. Seniors at LS, as well as other high schools, are eligible and do not need to be a member of your high school baseball team to earn a scholarship. 9- PAULA MARIE DANFORTH MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP - This scholarship is offering \$1,389.09 to a student who has shown the most improvement between his/her junior and senior years and plans to pursue a career in a social service or medical field. **NOTE: There is a scholarship fee in the amount of \$60. The fee will be taken from the total amount available for scholarship awards.**

10- THE SAM FOREMAN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP - This scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior who participated in either the Sudbury Youth Wrestling program or was a member of the L-SRHS Wrestling team. Applicants must write **an essay describing the influence that wrestling has had on the applicant's life**. The applicant may address issues such as how wrestling has shaped the past and how it may affect the applicant's future.

11- THURSDAY GARDEN CLUB OF SUDBURY SCHOLARSHIP - Applicants must be accepted by at least one school or internship program with the intent to study horticulture, conservation, forestry, landscape, floral design or environmental science. Applicants must be Lincoln-Sudbury seniors or L-S graduates currently enrolled in a college program.

12- SUDBURY GARDEN CLUB- Applicants must be accepted by at least one school with the intent to study horticulture, conservation, forestry, landscape, floral design or environmental science. Applicants must be Lincoln-Sudbury seniors or L-S graduates currently enrolled in a college program. The club will allocate \$2,000.00 this fiscal year to support a qualified candidate(s). Disbursement of funds to be determined on candidate merits; i.e. 1,000.00 each for two students OR 2,000.00 for one student.

13- SUDBURY GIRLS SOFTBALL SCHOLARSHIP- NANCY KIMBLE- Nancy Kimble is a current Sudbury

resident and long-time advocate for girls' sports programs.

Over the course of many years, Nancy has advanced the Sudbury Girls Softball (SGS) program as a league president, instructor, and coach. She co-founded the SGS summer travel program and continues to donate her time as a volunteer pitching instructor. In recognition of Nancy's significant contributions to SGS as well as her many other volunteer efforts within the Sudbury community, SGS will provide a \$1000 scholarship to a graduating senior in her name. The graduating senior who demonstrates integrity, sportsmanship, a willingness to help others on and off the field and a commitment to their community over the course of their time at Lincoln Sudbury Regional High School (LSRHS).

Applicants must meet the following criteria:

-Participated in the SGS town softball program -Participated in the LSRHS softball program (at the junior varsity or varsity level) -Student demonstrated opportunities to give back to their community over their years at LSRHS beyond the hour minimum set by LSRHS as a condition of graduation and/or gave back to the Sudbury Girls Softball youth program while a student at LSRHS

In addition, applicants must:

-Write a brief essay articulating how their community service experience has provided an impact to someone or within the community. -Provide a reference that is willing to write a summary of their character and/or how the students gave back to their community. -Applications must be submitted to the SGS Board for consideration OR emailed to <u>softballsudbury@gmail.com</u> by April 12, 2024

14- SUDBURY MAYNARD STOW HOCKEY PROGRAM provides the Jeff LaPlante Scholarship to a deserving graduating senior who has participated in the SMS Hockey program as a rostered player for at least three seasons. **The deadline for submission of completed applications is March of 2022**, with an award being announced no later than April. The 2024 awardee will receive a scholarship of \$2,500. Please follow this <u>link</u> for the application.

15- SUDBURY POLICE ASSOCIATION will offer \$800 to a deserving L-S senior who shows an interest in or is pursuing a career in public safety and service.

16- SUSTAINABLE SUDBURY SCHOLARSHIP FOR ENVIRONMENTAL LEADERSHIP - The scholarship is offering a graduating Lincoln-Sudbury graduating senior \$1,000 through academic and extracurricular interests and activities, commitment to Sustainable Sudbury's mission of raising environmental awareness and sponsoring sustainable, earth-friendly activities in our community and beyond. **Candidates should submit a short essay explaining why the applicant believes they meet our scholarship criteria.** Sustainable Sudbury defines its mission broadly and will consider applications from students in many fields. **17- SUDBURY YOUTH BASKETBALL SCHOLARSHIP-** Sudbury Youth Basketball will award one or more scholarships to graduating seniors who have participated in SYB, either by playing in our program and/or by coaching an SYB team. You are not required to have played basketball at LS to apply for the scholarship. 18- SUDBURY YOUTH FOOTBALL/CHEER SCHOLARSHIPS- Sudbury Youth Football and Cheer, will award \$2,000 at least two scholarships for students who have participated in SYFC. To be considered, for this scholarship students should have continued within LS football/cheer as either a player, mascot, assistant and/or has assisted with SYFC teams during their HS career minimally for one class year or season. In addition, the recipients demonstrated solid academic performance and served as a role model in the community through support of youth sports and related community service activities. 19- WALLY BELL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIPS - Three to five scholarships are awarded based on academics, need, community and school activities, participation in paid or volunteer work and maturity. A 15-minute interview with a panel of teachers from the SEA is required. Applicants must have attended Sudbury public schools (K-8) for at least three years. The 2024 recipient will receive \$1,000 for each scholarship.
